Jurisdiction

The meetings will be governed by the General Regulations of the Motorsports UK Limited, (Incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations, the Final Instructions for the event, and any written instructions that the organisers may issue for the event.

Roads closed for the running of this event are closed in accordance with the provisions of an order made under the Road Racing (Jersey) Law 1946, as amended. Road works and Events (JERSEY) Law: Article 50. 2016

Eligibility

The meetings will be open to all fully elected members of the organising club, The Midland Auto Club (MAC), Jersey Old Motor Club, Austin Healey Register, Aston Martin Owners Club, MG Owners club, Guernsey Motor and Light Car Club, Guernsey Kart & Motor club, JMC & LCC, Porsche Owners Club &

Jersey Kart & Motor Club. 750 Motor Club Ltd. Austin Healey Motor Club Ltd. Bentley Drivers Club Ltd. Bugatti Owners Club Ltd. Historic Sports car club. Jaguar Drivers Club. Lagonda Club Ltd. Morgan Sports car club Ltd. Vintage Sports car club Ltd. Veteran Car Club. Triumph Register. Woolbridge MC & MG car Club.

All Jersey competitors may be required to supply a marshal for the event.

The event is open to three & four wheel vehicles including replica cars, manufactured before 31st December 1997. Other vehicles may be accepted in this age group at the discretion of the organisers. There is an invitation class for Ford Escorts Mk1 & 2 with open engines & transmissions.

A Silhouette Class to encourage authentic body shaped vehicles to compete, providing they have the silhouette of an authentic produced production car prior to December 31, 1997. Lotus 7, Westfield, Caterham type derivatives cars. Will be accepted. Engines and transmissions are free; however, motorcycle engines will only be accepted at the discretion of the organisers.

Racing cars in different classes as set out in year periods, as set out in class CC, up to 31st December 1997.

Any Racing Car with a maximum of 2000 cc (including forced induction) and complying with Motorsport UK regulations will be accepted.

Any Competitor wishing to enter vehicles with non-standard body work or substantial mechanical changes are advised to submit photographs to the organisers and list modifications before making an entry.

Competitors wishing to enter vehicles with forced induction, fitted as standard up to 31st December 1997 are allowed. Vehicles fitted with force induction as nonstandard and fitted are advised to submit details and photographs of the vehicle prior to making an entry, and these vehicles will only be allowed at the organisers' discretion.

It is intended to offer modern vehicles the opportunity to do this event and classes K2 –Z3 will cover modern vehicles and engines and competition slick tyres. Entry, at the discretion of the event organisers.

Licences

Competitors must produce a valid Motorsport UK licence, as we are now running an **INTERCLUB permit for our events.**

Please make sure you have the right competition licence and membership card at signing on. You will require a RS Interclub licence as a minimum.

Competitors are asked to read the current Motorsport UK yearbook to acquaint themselves with the requirements for the production of Entrants licences and advertising.

Tyre Warming

Tyre warming as per S.9,3.1. Tyre warming may only be carried out in the designated tyre warming area. Forward momentum must be maintained at all times.

Tyres/ Wheels

Slick tyres are prohibited unless Motorsports UK regulations allow.

Tyres is free within the following parameters: -

Dunlop competition tyres of a type up to and including M series, Englebert competition tyres. any E marked road going tyre or tyre listed in the current Motorsports UK yearbook L List 1A, or 1B provided that they are E marked. Any vehicle using tyres in List 1B will be entered into a modified class.

Drivers who present their vehicles with different tyres to the above must inform the scrutineer and may be asked to join a modified class and will be reported to the Clerk of the Course.

Post 1945 vehicles must run on treaded tyres, which may be road tyres complying with the Motor Vehicles Construction and Use Regulations, or racing tyres as long as the latter has a tread pattern which does not allow uncut areas of the tread surface to exceed 25mm in any direction between the grooves, which themselves must have a minimum width of 3mm.

To be eligible for classes I J & K, vehicles of monocoque construction and those with rear wings will be allowed, provided that they were standard on the car at the appropriate date.

Only the original manufacturers wheel sizes will be permitted with a tolerance of 25mm, up to a maximum rim width of six inches. Cars which have an original wheel rim width size in excess of six inches, will be permitted but may be asked to run in a modified class.

As a general rule no pre-war car may run on a rim width wider than five inches.

Brakes

All standard classes: - only the original brakes fitted to the car in series production form or as homologated by the manufacturer up to 31/12/1997 will be permitted. The brakes may not be modified in any way but ducting and scoops will be allowed. Any other modification will make the vehicle modified and will be moved to a relevant class.

Technical Regulations

All vehicles are required to comply with Motorsports UK technical regulations with regards to sprint and hill climbs and with any requirements that have been laid down in the supplementary regulations.

Competitors are reminded that information given to the organisers will be stored on a computer database and may be retrieved for future events.

The organisers reserve the right to amalgamate a class should the minimum of three per class not be attained.

Noise

Noise restrictions will be as per the current Motorsports UK yearbook.

Flag signals

If a RED flag is displayed, competing vehicles should come to a standstill when practicable and await further instructions from the course marshals.

Safety

Safety is paramount and competitors are asked to read section K of the current Motorsports UK yearbook.

Vehicles will need to be presented with race numbers (not supplied) attached and all safety clothing.

Practice / Event

All competitors will have the opportunity to walk the course freely before competition to acquaint themselves with the course. There will be one practice run followed by official runs.

The Length of the course is a standing $\frac{1}{4}$ quarter of a mile. On closed public roads. The road is a sealed surface and is relatively straight.

Timing / Start

Competitors will start individually; the starting signal will be with a GO signal and the vehicle will cut an electronic beam with a timing strut in accordance with the current Motorsports UK yearbook.

Vehicles will start from a standing start and all competitors will be deemed to have started if the centre of the rear wheel spindle has crossed the start line.

Should the timing equipment fail the start will be by green flag.

Finish

The finish line will be marked either side of the road by two boards bearing chequered flags. Please shut down the power after these boards. There will be a series of countdown boards and upon reaching the single 1 on it you will be expected to be going no more than 10mph.

Officials will monitor the road and anyone not complying with this instruction may be excluded from the results or the event.

Results

Will be published in accordance with the current Motorsports UK yearbook.

Protests

As per current Motorsports UK yearbook.

Abandonment

The organisers reserve the right to postpone or abandon the meeting for whatever reason. In the event of abandonment or postponement, entry fees shall be returned as follows: Up to 50% of the entry fee may be retained for event administrations costs if the event has not started. Once the event has commenced all monies will be retained.

Awards

There will be no awards, however, Class records will be recorded.

Entries

Entries will open upon publication of these regulations and will close on 21 May 2022. Post-dated cheques will be accepted.

All entries shall be submitted on the official entry form and must be received by the entries secretary with all monies as laid down in these Supplementary Regulations.

The fee must be paid prior to the event otherwise you are not insured to compete.

Late entries will be accepted at the organiser's discretion at an additional cost of £40 pounds.

The final selection shall be at the organiser's discretion.

Entries received and subsequently cancelled up to the closing date will receive all monies back.

Entries cancelled from the closing date to 3 days before the beginning of the event will receive 50% back.

Entries cancelled after this time no monies will be returned.

ENTRIES MAY BE CONSIDERED AFTER 21 May 2022.

There will be a minimum of 40 and a maximum of 110 entries, and if the entries exceed this, the final selection shall be at the organiser's discretion.

A Parent / Legal Guardian agreement must be completed for this event for all competitors under the age of 18 years.

Shared entries will be accepted at organisers discretion.

Double entries will not be accepted.

Competitors are reminded that the information submitted, is stored on a computer database, and may be retrieved for future events.
